





The District 9 Service Team is honored to host Dr. Rick McCaslin, professor of Texas History at the University of North Texas and a member of Knox-Corinthian Lodge #851 A.F. & A.M. Professor McCaslin will be lecturing on Freemasons and Texas History in honor of the month of Texas Independence which occurred on March 3, 1836, over 182 years ago. Throughout its history, Freemasons have always been at the forefront of pivotal moments in this history of this state. Blood Drive Date is Set

ee Lodge #435 participates in the Gift of Life Program, which coordinates blood drives with Masonic Lodges throughout the state of Texas so patients receive the lifesaving gift they need. The event is scheduled for **April 13, 2019 from 11;30AM to 3:00PM**. A Carter Blood Drive Unit at the Walmart parking lot on the corner of Preston and 380 in Prosper, TX will carry out the blood collection but volunteers are needed to help advertise, solicit blood donors and to assist the blood unit operators.

Texas Masons began the Gift of Life Program 15 years ago in the North Texas area, and today, regional committees have expanded to Houston, San Antonio and the Rio Grande Valley. The facts are startling – a blood transfusion is needed every 90 seconds. The amount of blood needed increases during holidays and over the Summer months. Volunteer blood

donors are the essential link to saving lives. Any annual surplus collected can be used in emergencies, both public and fraternal. The Gift of Life Program is part of a rich Masonic tradition of helping to meet healthcare needs.

Gift of Life benefits the three fraternal hospitals: Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas, the Shrine Burn Center in Galveston and the Shrine Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, as well as community hospitals throughout the state. The program encourages the Masonic

Lodges of Texas to hold community blood drives and to direct the blood and blood products from these drives for the benefit of the three fraternal hospitals or a local community healthcare facility. This charity allows physicians to provide needed surgery and other treatments to the children.

So, come and do what you can on **April 13, 2019** whether it be donating blood or time and efforts. All are needed to make the Blood Drive a success.

Lamar Award


Mirabeau B. Lamar

In December 1838, Mirabeau B. Lamar, a Mason, became president of the Republic of Texas and distinguished himself as the "Father of Texas Education" for his support of a public school system. In his first address to the Congress, he pleaded for the creation of a public school system in Texas. He declared, "If we desire to establish a republican government upon a broad and permanent basis, it will become our duty to adopt a comprehensive and well regulated system of mental and moral culture."

He proposed the set aside of public lands for the creation of a permanent endowment to support public education. His educational views met with the approval of Congress and provisions were made for public education. Congress set aside three leagues (13,285 acres) of land in each county to

support primary schools and an additional fifty leagues (221,420 acres) to support two colleges in 1839. In 1840, Congress set aside an additional league for the support of county schools. In addition, they made provisions for the certification of teachers. Once again, many of these legislators were Masons.

Mirabeau B. Lamar Scholarship and Award for Excellence in Education



In 1988, under the leadership of Grand Master Graham Childress, the Lamar Award of Excellence was established. The Lamar Medal is awarded to students and educators in recognition of outstanding personal achievement in academics, citizenship, community service, or sports.

Relationship to a current or deceased Mason is NOT required for consideration.



Hello Brothers of Lee Lodge #435 in Prosper, TX. You should have recently received a text or e-mail inviting you to join...BAND. It is an app we are using to stay informed, send notifications of upcoming events or chat with one another.

BAND is a mobile community application that facilitates group communication. Created by Naver Corporation, the service is available on iOS, Android, and Desktop. Users can create separate spaces for communicating with members of different groups depending on the purpose of those groups. Types of groups include existing circles such as sports teams, marching bands, campus groups, faith groups, teams, friends, family as well as interest-based groups, like those for hobbyists, gamers, and fans, which are also searchable within the app. BAND is a wildly popular social app in Korea whose number of monthly active users surpassed that of Facebook by June, 2014 according to Nielson-Korean Click.^[1]

BAND's core features are Board, Chat, Calendar, and Album. Main communications happen on Board where announcements and comments are posted.

Polling, file sharing, and image/ video sharing are also possible on Board. The Discover feature was added in March, 2015 which allows users to search for and join interest-based groups by using certain keywords. There are three types of **BAND** groups: Secret Band, Closed Band, and Public Band. Secret Band is a non-searchable group where members can join only by invitation. Closed Band is a searchable group, but only members who have already joined can see the content. Public Band is a searchable group whose content is accessible to both members and nonmembers.

Unlike messaging apps, **BAND** has a membership system where Administrators and Co-Administrators have certain privileges, including Admin-only posting, deleting other members' content, approving/disapproving membership, removing members, or restricting sending out invites to non-members. Key functions of each feature are:

• Board: Members can create a post and leave comments. Multiple attachments can be included in a post, including photos, videos, files, location, poll, and event. Read count shows how many members have read the post. While postings are organized chronologically, new members can also check existing content prior to their joining the group. Board also supports

- hashtags and search function for categorizing and searching content.
- Chat: Similar to messenger apps, Chat feature allows for chatting with entire group members, select few, or one-on-one. Chat is used for immediate conversations that have non-specific topics.
- Calendar: On BAND Calendar, members can save group events with date, time, and location and ask for RSVP. Reminder alarm may be set. Members may save the event details on their Calendar on the phone.
- Album: Members can create collective photo albums where every member can upload photos. Multiple albums can be created by event. Up to 100 photos can be uploaded at a time. [2]
- Discover: The Discover feature allows members to search for and join interest-based public Bands.

There is no limit on the number of members per **BAND** group.

POSTING GUIDELINES

The following are the posting guidelines for "The Band". The Band is a social media application that can run on a cellphone or desktop. The Lee #435 Band is a closed band and membership is by invitation only. The Band was created as a means of two way communications between Masons to post and discuss events relating to Masonry, not just Lee Masonry but all Masonry as recognized by the TGLT. Although this Band was created and maintained outside Lee Masonic Lodge #435 we will make every effort to comply with the wishes of the officers of the lodge. In the event it becomes too restrictive to continue the ongoing communications between Band members it is our right to change the name of this Band to any other mutually agreeable Band.

MEMBERSHIP GUIDELINES:

This Band is by invitation only and may only include Masons. Presently it is restricted to Master Masons only but this may change in the future. Masons outside Lee #435 may join by invitation as long at their sponsoring invite vouches for the invited member.

RIGHT TO CREATE AND ADMINISTER:

Creators and Administrators of the Lee #435 Band reserve the right to create other Bands outside of Lee #435. Other Bands may include Mason only Bands or Bands associated with other interests outside Masonry. Masonic related Bands may include but are not limited to District 9A, 9B, Hella Shrine, Shrine Clubs, and Scottish Rite.

POSTING GUIDELINES:

- 1. This Band is tyled for EA at all times.
- 2. There will be no posts that aren't appropriate for an EA.
- 3. It is prohibited to post any content that violates any verbal or written agreements between members.
- 4. Each member will be able to "invite" other members.
- 5. Each member who sends out an "invite" to prospective members outside of Lee #435 is vouching for the authenticity of the invitee.
- 6. Topics of discussion are open for Masonic topics, Masonic events and any other topic of choice with the exception that there will be no discussion of politics or religion. Members should use their better judgement when posting. The Administrator has the right to remove posts that are deemed inappropriate.
- 7. A Calendar of events will be posted to include events in 9A for blue lodges, Scottish Rite and Shrine. The calendar will also show social events that are available. Each posting to the calendar comes with an RSVP feature. It is important to RSVP yes or no to each event posted. RSVP becomes most important to the SS for meal planning so help him out.
- 8. The membership area lists contact information for all members. You may use this area to communicate privately with other members.
- 9. Documents of interest can be uploaded to the Band.
- 10. Members can post photos to the Band.
- 11. Questions, changes, suggestions or comments should be directed to Robert Bell by chat or email. Contact information can be found in the member area of this Band.

TGLT

This Band is more restrictive that required by GLOT. You can find an almost identical form of communication by visiting GLOT Facebook page where they list over 3,000 members.
